#### **New Business**

#### 16. Member to Member Communications - John Scimone

- a. Presently, our membership's communications are fractured.
  - Some use email, some use Telegram, groups use texts, and some use Facebook
  - Obstructs a cohesive sense of community
- b. We've tried to find a communication venue in the past, but we've been unsuccessful
  - Poor adoption
    - Confusing interfaces
    - People aren't already there
  - Facebook probably has the most member-to-member communication, but due to privacy concerns it's a poor platform to suggest members use
  - Twitter is not good for managing a community
  - Seeking suggestions if anyone has them

Ongoing conversation re: the possibility of Discord. Vic and Val have been testing out with David Beers and like it.

Drew or John S can/will share invite link to CT Makers Collective Discord with anyone who is interested. A handful of the Electronics Nerds already in there, as well as folks from MCT, MakeHaven.

MakerspaceCT and MakeHaven have also used Discord successfully.

George pointed out that the real issue isn't the tech-savvy people, it's the non tech-savvy people. If the app isn't simple it won't necessarily help.

Casey asked that whatever we do it be simple since he'll be asked about it.

# 17. New Committee Suggestion - John Scimone

- a. IT Committee
  - We need a committee that will take care of our digital infrastructure much like the facilities committee takes care of our physical infrastructure
  - This committee has existed informally for some time now
  - Should be empowered to plan, implement, and maintain the digital infrastructure of Spark. Should facilitate communications, internet connectivity, web infrastructure, etc.
  - Formalizing this committee will provide transparency, improve member involvement in IT, and create better processes
  - I propose that this committee be formally created with co-chairs John Scimone and Drew Gates.
- Casey expressed concern that he would like to make sure we are presenting a unified front in terms of branding and text.
- George expressed concern that Casey should be able to make executive decisions where necessary. Board/Member Council can follow up as needed.
